The NIHSS was originally designed as a research tool to measure baseline data on patients in acute stroke clinical trials. Scale Definition . Level of Consciousness . 0 . Alert; keenly responsive. 1. Not alert; but arousable by minor stimulation to obey, answer, or respond. 2 . Not alert; requires repeated stimulation to attend, or is obtunded and requires strong or painful stimulation to make movements (not stereotyped). 3. Responds only with reflex motor

NIH Stroke Scale

The NIH Stroke Scale has many caveats buried within it. If your patient has prior known neurologic deficits e.g. prior weakness, hemi- or quadriplegia, blindness, etc. or is intubated, has a language barrier, etc., it becomes especially complicated. In those cases, consult the NIH Stroke Scale website. MDCalc's version is an attempt to clarify many of these confusing caveats, but cannot and should not be substituted for the official protocol.

NIH Stroke Scale/Score (NIHSS) - MDCalc

If patient is thought to be normal, an adequate sample of speech must be obtained by asking patient to read or repeat words from the NIH Stroke Scale document pages 6 and 8 (pdf, 495kb). If the patient has severe aphasia, the clarity of articulation of spontaneous speech can be rated.

*The NIHSS is a 15-item neurologic examination stroke scale used to evaluate the effect of acute cerebral infarction on the levels of consciousness, language, neglect, visual-field loss, extraocular movement, motor strength, ataxia, dysarthria, and sensory loss.
